


Summerset Arts Festival 2018 - Expression of Interest

The Cultural Development Fund is available to assist not-for-profit groups to run events or activities that nurture the culture and the arts, and enhances community well-being.

Following a recent review of the City's Cultural Development Fund, there have been significant changes to this funding platform. The major changes include an increase to funding levels, up to \$20,000 for Level 1 Flagship Events, and up to \$5,000 for Level 3 Projects and Small Events.
